Over 1A and 1NT: Step 5 shows 4450 or 4441 hands. Steps $6-8$ are void splinters. Over $2 \diamond$ and $2 \diamond$ : Step 5 sets the suit shown by responder and demands cues. Higher steps do not exist.

Against suction，pass then double is a GF in the single suit opponents could have．
