After weak 2M opening and 2NT ask: raise to 3 = minimum; with better hand: (other) major shows 4 cards, 3N=2 of top 3 hons; m=better minor. For 2D – 2N – response shows features</p> <p>6. After 1any opening, 2 level response shows 10+hcp or rule of 14 (hcp+no.)</p>
