## Note 1: Michaels cue Bids:

- 12-2*
- 1-2

Both majors 5(+ ) / 5(+)

- $1 \boldsymbol{v}-2 \boldsymbol{\text { - }}=5(+)+5(+)$ minor
- 1-2 $-2 \boldsymbol{=}(+)+5(+)$ minor

Response 2 NT : asking which is a minor

## Note 2: Unusual 2NT

After any bid to show the two lowerest-ranking unbid suits

- $12-2 N T=5+\& 5+\bullet$
- $1 *-2 N T=5+\& \& 5+\vee$
- 1 - $-2 N T=5+\& 5+$


## Note 3: 1NT opening:

a) Stayman 8+ HCP

1NT-2
Responses: $2 \downarrow$ = no major
$2 \boldsymbol{\psi}=4$
$2 \boldsymbol{~} \boldsymbol{=} 4$
b) Jacoby $0+\mathrm{HCP}$

## Note 4: 2NT opening:

2NT ( $20-21 \mathrm{HCP}$ ) - a) $3(4+\mathrm{HCP})$ Puppet Stayman = do you have 5 majors
Responses: - $2=$ no 5 card major but at least one 4 card major
(Responses after $2-3 N T=n o 4$ major suit; $-3 \mathbf{~}=4 \boldsymbol{4}$;
$-3 \boldsymbol{4}=4 \boldsymbol{\varphi})$
$-2 \boldsymbol{\varphi}=5$
$-2 \boldsymbol{a}=5$
-b) $3 \uparrow 0+\mathrm{HCP}, 5+\boldsymbol{\square}$
-c) $3 \boldsymbol{a} 0+\mathrm{HCP}, 5+$

## Note 5: 4NT RKCB - ask for 5 key cards

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Responses: 50 or 3
    \(5 *=1\) or 4
    \(5 \vee=2\)
    \(5 \boldsymbol{s}=2+Q\) of trumps
    \(5 \mathrm{NT}=2\) = void
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## Note 6: Ogust - after partner has made a weak-two opening

$2 \triangleleft \uparrow-2 N T=$ describe yours hand
Responses:
-3e shows a "minimal" hand with a "poor" suit
$-3 \star$ shows a "minimal" hand with a "good" suit
-3४ shows a "maximal" hand with a "poor" suit
-34 shows a "maximal" hand with a "good" suit
-3NT shows a "solid" suit (that is, AKQ of the long suit)

Note 7: Gerber is a $4 *$ response to a no-trumps bid that asks partner how many aces he holds

Responses after 4 are:

- $4 \downarrow=0$ or 4
- $4 \boldsymbol{4}=1$
- $4 \mathbf{4}=2$
- $4 \mathrm{NT}=3$
