


DEFENSIVE AND COMPETITIVE BIDDING
OVERCALLS (Style: Responses: 1 / 2 Level; Reopening)
Lead directing, at least Hxxxx, Michael's cuebid
Can be HHxx
When allowed we play that overcalling 1nt over 1mi is 0-8 any Fav.
Majors: 2nt inv+ 4-card support if overcall was on level 1, else it is natural, overcall in the opps' suit 10+ at least 3-card support
Minors: overcall in the opps' suit 10+ at least 3-card support

Opening bid of 2c **in** 1st/2nd/3rd **seat at** NV

Shows: 0-8 any, may be stronger in 3rd seat

Detailed Description:

2C shows 0-8 HCP and usually doesn't contain the following: 4333, 5440, 6ma, 7mi, 5ma – 5mi, both majors. Furthermore it doesn't have the playing strength to invite opposite a 15-17 NT. In 3rd seat we may have a bit more, usually if we have 4+ clubs and are not worried about missing game.

The general style is to open 2c as much as often, without missing game, that's why we also have the exceptions

The response structure is complicated as we have to fit a lot of handtypes: with strong hands we usually use 2d showing 1 major or 19-21 bal.. otherwise we use 2sp which is an artificial gameforce. 2h is scramble, 3x (not 3c) is weak preemptive

On the continuations we act as if opener had passed, and try to make the logical response to partners bid. For instance pass/correct bid on partners 2d multi etc.

Responses and Rebids in Uncontested auctions

With what hands will responder pass the opening bid?

Lots of medium to weak hands with or without clubs, usually no 6c ma unless really weak. We like to pass a lot as that leaves us a lot of room to escape and puts the pressure on the opponents

Meanings of other responses and rebids:

2D shows 1 major or 19-21 balanced, 2H is scramble, usually major but may be hearts + mi, 2sp is GF any, 3c is both minors

Competitive Agreements

Responses after opponent's DBL (including Pass, RDBL and expected follow-ups)

Pass is 4+ clubs, XX is 0-3 clubs scramble, 2x is natural

Responses after opponent's overcall:

As if opener had passed

Rebids after 4th hand DBLs the response:

Natural

Rebids after 4th hand overcalls:

TO doubles and natural

Detailed Description:

Overcalling 1nt shows 0-8 any and usually doesn't contain the following: 4333, 5440, 6ma, 7mi, 5ma + 5mi, both majors. Furthermore it doesn't have the playing strength to invite opposite a 15-17 NT.

Our general style is to do it as much as possible, with the least risk of missing game... That is why we have the exceptions.

The response structure is kind of weird, but 2d shows 1 major or a strong balanced hand, 2c is trying to find the best partscore, usually unbalanced type, 2h is also aiming to find best partscore, but usually both majors or hearts + a minor. 2sp is artificial game force.

On the continuations we act as if overcaller had passed instead, and bid logically opposite what partner has shown. For instance pass/correct bid on partners 2d multi etc.

Responses and Rebids When Responder Passes

With what hands will advancer pass the overcall?

Lots of weak intermediate hands, especially hands w. 4+ clubs tend to pass

Meanings of other advances and follow ups:

2C = scramble, 2D= 1 major or 19-21 NT, 2h: scramble, usually both majors, 2sp: GF any, 2nt 18-19 NT

Competitive Agreements

Responses after opponent's DBL (including Pass, RDBL and expected follow-ups)

XX: usually 1-suiter, 2C+: The suit and a higher, Pass: Interest in playing 1nt

Responses after opponent's bid:

As if overcaller had passed

Rebids after opener DBLs the overcall (1X)-2Y-(P)-P-(DBL)-?

XX: usually 1-suiter, 2C+: The suit and a higher, Pass: Interest in playing 1nt
